Frost is Possible Into May

If you’ve been living under a rock for the past week you may not have noticed there’s a winter storm warning in effect from 11pm to 9am tomorrow. You may be thinking after this little cold snap you’ll plant veggies... might oughta wait. According to NOAA 30 year weather data from local stations, the timeframe you should have in your head is roughly May 1st. After that time, there’s a 10 percent chance temps will fall lower than 32°F. So... don’t get too excited after it warms up.

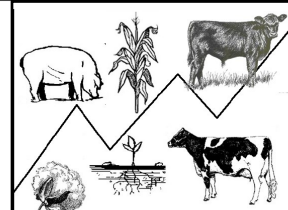
